

## RCIA Godparents & Sponsor Info

## What are they?

Godparents and sponsors are practicing Catholics who serve as mentors and guides for those receiving the sacraments. They agree to a lifelong spiritual relationship with their candidate. They are concerned for the candidate's spiritual well-being and keep them in prayer. During the process towards the candidate's reception of the sacraments, the godparent or sponsor serves as a resource for discussion, questions and concerns.

For those to be baptized, there may be one godfather and/or one godmother. For baptized Christians receiving the sacrament of confirmation, there is one sponsor.

The godparents or sponsor may be picked by the candidate. If a candidate doesn't have one, we will try to match them with a parishioner. The pastor has the final say whether or not a person may serve in either capacity.

## What are the requirements?

- 1. Be a practicing Catholic, in good standing with the Church.
  - e.g. a practicing Catholic attends Sunday Mass and frequents the sacraments.
  - e.g. someone *not* in good standing would be one who is in an irregular marriage situation, or has an occupation contrary to Catholic faith or morals.
- 2. Have already received the sacraments of baptism, reconciliation, first communion and confirmation.
- 3. Not be a parent of the candidate related by blood.
- 4. Be at least 16 years old.
- 5. Not be in a non-binding romantic relationship with the candidate.
- 6. Inasmuch as possible, attend RCIA classes with the candidate.
- 7. Be present for the liturgical ceremonies of the candidate.
  - a. for the unbaptized, particularly at the Rite of Acceptance, Rite of Election and the Easter Vigil.
  - b. for the baptized, particularly at the Rite of Acceptance and the Reception of the Baptized (or the Easter Vigil, if received then).
